## Gift of Water will be reintroduced in Jeannette

Addressing potable water needs



### Clean Water=Healthy Kids

Last week, Gift of Water staff member, Lamothe gave a presentation on water purification to the July Haiti Project travel team in Port Au Prince. Haiti Project sought out the expertise of Gift of Water after community leaders in Jeannette shared concerns about water borne illnesses. As a partnership, and under the strong leadership of Pere Jean Lenord Quatorze, St. Marc's and the Haiti Project support the reintroduction of the Gift of Water double bucket system (with funding from the Matching Campaign for Clean Water).



This system employs a simple purification method in each household to address common water borne illnesses that deplete children of nourishment and energy. Nurses at the health clinic in Jeannette report high incidents of diarrhea following rainfalls. Drinking water is vulnerable to contamination when the debris and bacteria filled run-off flows from roofs and gutters to fill the water catchment cisterns. Often water-borne illnesses keep students from attending school therefore putting them at risk of failing their grade or dropping out.
